Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

For a few weeks now, we have started seeing Christmas trees being erected, holiday lights decorating houses, and cashiers wearing Santa hats all the while trying to sell holiday baskets to give out for Christmas. But what pains our hearts is that if you ask any of these Thais what Christmas is about, their answer will equate to thinking it is a “foreign” holiday for gift giving purposes only.

This was evident when we went to visit Kamnan Sak, the sub-district headman of West Pak Phanang, and his family to read the Christmas story from the bible and to sing some Christmas songs. When we asked him if he knew the meaning behind Christmas, he couldn't really give a clear answer. This was also evident when the mayor of Pak Phanang invited the church to sing Christmas songs in front of the town on Dec. 24th. His office kept emphasizing that we need to make it “*sanook, sanook*” (fun), and even requested someone to dress up in a Santa Claus outfit.

Yet this is the very reason why we are here in Thailand. We are reminded this Christmas that just as Jesus Christ “became flesh and made his dwelling among us” (John 1:14) and “became obedient to death – even death on a cross” (Phil. 2:8), we also want to be incarnate in Thailand bearing the cross and testifying to the good news of Jesus Christ!

Please pray for us as well as all the workers in Thailand. December is a busy month filled with outreach events to share about the true meaning of Christmas. Pray that as we throw out the seeds of God's love, they will be planted in the hearts of the Thais and bear fruit.

We want to take this time to wish you the Merriest of Christmas and a New Year filled with God's power and blessing. We are so grateful for each one of you. Your prayers and support have helped carry us through this year. We take joy in knowing that even though we are not physically together, we share in celebrating Jesus' birth together as one family in Christ.
